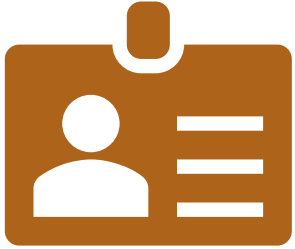
Key Takeaways
