

- Licensed by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC).
 - License renewal in 2011 open & public process.
 - Free to all members of the public.
 - Recreation is allowed but restricted to protect water quality and habitat functions.
 - Day use only; no overnight camping
 - 2,500 acres of land, 1,800 acres of reservoir open for recreation
 & hunting.
 - Patrolled by City of Everett Watershed Patrol and WDFW law enforcement

- In the Spada Lake Basin, PUD provides:
 - 7 recreation sites signage, picnic tables.
 - 2 boat launches for access to Spada Lake, but not gas motors, inflatables or swimming allowed.
 - 6 Restroom facilities.
 - Trailhead parking for access to DNR's Boulder and Greider trails

WATER QUALITY REGULATIONS

This lake provides 80% of the drinking water for Snohomish County.

To protect this main source of drinking water,

please obey all water quality restrictions.

- Boat launching only at designated sites.
- ▶ Electric motors only on all boats.
- All motorized vehicles must stay on improved roads.
- Picnicking allowed only at designated sites.
- Pets must remain in vehicles or be leashed at all times. Pets must be kept out of the lake. No livestock allowed.
- NO camping on PUD lands.
- NO swimming, wading and/or water-contact activities. This includes all board-type water sports where body contact with the lake is likely.
- NO use of inflatable devices on lake.
