Logs arriving at the South Bay Log Dump were unloaded from railcars into the bay. In the early years, the "boom crew" sorted floating logs by hand. Wearing spiked "caulk" boots (pronounced 'cork'), these men balanced

This portable building, and other "skid shacks" like it, were built on wood sleds or skids and dragged from place to place within a logging camp. When needed at another camp, they were picked up by a locomotive crane and transported by rail.
