WHAT

Long-term Conservation Strategy

DNR is developing a long-term marbled murrelet conservation strategy that does not appreciably reduce the likelihood of survival and recovery of the species in the wild and that will, to the maximum extent practical, minimize and mitigate impact.

DNR is developing the strategies consistent with its trust duties.



WHY

The Interim Strategy isn't permanent

DNR must fulfill its commitment to develop a long-term habitat conservation strategy for the marbled murrelet and amend its 1997 State Trust Lands Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP).




HOW

Amending the 1997 State Trust Lands HCP

- DNR must submit an amendment to the HCP
- DNR and USFWS will issue an Environmental Impact Statement on the Amendment
- DNR must apply for an amended Incidental Take Permit from USFWS

Release in Early September 2018


- Release the HCP amendment
- Release the Revised Draft EIS
- 60-day public comment period
