Trust Land Transfer Preliminary Draft Recommendations Prioritization Criteria and Scoring

February 24, 2022

Below are the preliminary prioritization criteria for evaluating TLT proposals. TLT Phase 2 Work Group members were asked to select 6 criteria that were the most important to them in a survey. The following criteria are listed in order of those with the most votes.

Under each criteria there are statements or questions that DNR staff have provided to explain the purpose of the criteria as well as break down different levels of information that are relevant to that criteria. There are also proposed point ranges for each level of information to guide scoring. Successful proposals may not necessarily need to address every criteria or every aspect of a criteria. However, applicants should elaborate on all criteria that are relevant to their projects.

Criteria: Social Values

Votes: 8

Describe the social values that will be associated with this parcel once it is transferred. These social values could include, but are not limited to, public use and/or recreation, open or green space, aesthetics, cultural or historic significance, scientific research, outdoor education.

- To what extent will the parcel provide opportunities for physical activity, social and cultural connections, scientific research, or community education once transferred?
- Does the site contain features of historical, cultural, and/or tribal significance that have been formally documented?
- Describe any multiple benefits provided, such as if public use or social values are compatible with any identified conservation or habitat values.

How the receiving agency plans for provide for the preservation or cultural or historic attributes while providing for identified conservation, fish and wildlife habitat, and/or public use.

Identify and discuss any potential negative impacts to OBC/VP by the proposed transfer. Provide evidence of potential positive impacts that will result from the transfer.

Identify any Underserved Populations in the local community that will be affected by the transfer, which are described as follows:

Demographic Measures for Underserved Populations (UP)

- The median household income level in the census tract where the project is located is below the median statewide household income level (\$66,174 as of 2017).
- Based on percentage, there are more people of color in the census tract where the project is located than the statewide percentage (31 percent as of 2017).
- Based on percentage, there are more people with a disability in the census tract where the project is located than the statewide percentage (13 percent as of 2017).

Describe an identified disparity in social, health, or environmental services that are impacted by this proposal.

* "Overburdened community" means a geographic area where vulnerable populations face combined, multiple environmental harms and health impacts, and includes, but is not limited to, highly impacted communities as defined in RCW 19.405.020 (ESSSB 5441 Sec. 2 (11)). "Vulnerable populations" means population groups that are more likely to be at higher risk for poor health outcomes in response to environmental harms (ESSSB 5441 Sec. 2 (14)).

Criteria: Community Involvement and Support

Votes: 6

What is the level of *community involvement* and *support* for the proposal?

Criteria: Conservation Values

Votes: 6

Describe the ecological and biological quality of the parcel and any unique, state or federally endangered or threatened plant, fish or wildlife species or communities that are present or targeted on the parcel, or any 'wide-ranging or migratory species.

Explain how the site is unique or significant on a global, regional, state, ecosystem, or watershed level. Explain the scope or scale of the contribution provided by this parcel.

- How unique is the site in relation to habitat quality, connectivity, diversity, and rarity?
- How is the site important in providing critical habitat or biological function for the identified wildlife species or communities?
- How does this site compare to others of the same type?

Are there other protected lands (public and private) near or adjoining this site that have complementary or compatible land uses for conservation or for the identified species? Is the parcel next to or linked to enhance already protected lands?

Are the lands to be managed in a manner consistent with the needs of the species or communities identified above? Provide evidence to support.

Is this site part of a larger ownership? If so, describe the connectivity and management of the other land.

What stewardship practices will be used to benefit fish and other wildlife habitat if the parcel is transferred?

What is the capacity and expertise of the receiving agency to monitor and manage the conservation or habitat values once the parcel is transferred?

Does the parcel fit within a landscape level conservation effort, plan, or strategy; or will the parcel be included in landscape level conservation effort or management plan once transferred?
