### **Foreword**

This is the 53nd consecutive annual Washington Timber Harvest Report in a publication series which began with the 1949 timber harvest data. The State Division of Forestry, Department of Conservation and Development, was responsible for reporting these data prior to the creation of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) in 1957. The DNR first published the harvest report for the year 1957.

Over the years, the timber harvest reporting process has been adjusted as the means of collecting data have changed. In recent years it has become impossible to accurately report acres harvested from most landowner groups. Therefore, in 1987 the decision was made to drop acres from the timber harvest publications. Acres of timberlands harvested were last included in the "1986 Washington Timber Harvest Report."

Many private timber harvesters are not recording the timberland owner's class on their Forest Excise Tax returns. As a result, for 2001, 859.9 million board feet of 2.79 billion board feet of private timber harvest was harvested on unknown private ownerships, i.e., this harvest was not classified as Forest Industry, Private Large, or Private Small. A description of how these data were handled is described in the "Data Adjustments" section of the text which begins on page 5.

Harvests reported to the Department of Revenue as tonnage (a weight-based measure) were converted to thousands of board feet (MBF) Scribner rule using the conversion factors outlined on page 2.

Beginning in 1992, DNR shifted primarily to selling lump-sum timber sales and as a consequence discontinued providing harvest volumes by species. The procedure used to estimate the distribution of the harvest volume by species is described on page 7 in the "Data Adjustments" section.

### Introduction

The Timber Harvest Report provides an annual historical record of timber harvest activities by county, ownership class and species. Along with previous harvest reports, it reflects harvest trends over time. The Timber Harvest report is provided as a public service under authority of RCW 43.30.135.

This timber harvest report is formatted in the same manner as has been used beginning with the timber harvest report for 1996. Please note that the tribal timberlands, referred to as "Native American," are included as a category of private timberlands. This was done to be consistent with the latest federal Washington forests report titled "Washington's Public and Private Forests," Resource Bulletin PNW-RB-218. This report was published in January, 1997 with data for 1992 by the USDA Forest Service, Pacific Northwest Research Station, Portland, Oregon.

Another change implemented in the 1996 timber harvest report is that the four product class categories: "Old Growth," "Young Growth," "Cull/Utility," and "Salvage" are no longer included. This change was made because the data are often not reported using these four harvest categories and therefore it is impossible to accurately place information within the four product classes.

### Organization of Data

Timber harvest volumes are listed by county and displayed by ownership class and species.

### **OWNERSHIP**

Timber harvests from private timberlands are included within four owner classes: Native American, Forest Industry, Private Large, and Private Small.

Native American<sup>1</sup> — Tribal and allotted lands held in trust by the federal government. Most of the data were provided by the U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs, but some tribes manage their own timberland ownerships and reported the harvest volumes from their tribal lands.

Volumes for the Native American (formerly BIA) owner class are reported for the federal fiscal year which runs from October 1<sup>st</sup> through September 30<sup>th</sup> of the following calendar year. The tribal data have been consistently reported in this way beginning with the 1977 timber harvest report. Harvest data for the other seven owner classes are all reported in terms of the calendar year (January through December).

The Department of Revenue, using forest excise tax returns, supplied the timber harvest data for Forest Industry, Private Large and Private Small timberland owners. These three private forest ownership categories are defined as follows:

Forest Industry — Companies and individuals operating wood-using plants.

<u>Private Large</u> — Nonindustrial companies and individuals not operating wood-using plants but with statewide holdings totaling 1,000 or more acres.

<u>Private Small</u> — Nonindustrial companies and individuals not operating wood-using plants and having statewide holdings totaling less than 1,000 acres.

Public timberlands are classified into four categories as follows:

<u>State</u> — The designation used to report harvests from state-owned lands managed by the Department of Natural Resources for various trust beneficiaries. The data source was DNR's Product Sales & Leasing Division. Although the State's fiscal year runs July 1 through June 30 of the following calendar year, the State harvest is reported in the 2001 timber harvest report for the period from January 1 through December 31, 2001.

<u>Other Non-federal</u> — These are public lands owned by cities, counties, public utility districts, and state agencies other than state-owned lands managed by DNR. Questionnaires were mailed to the various agencies requesting calendar year timber harvests.

National Forest — The federal harvest from lands managed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Forest Service. The data source is the USDA Forest Service, Region 6 Office, Portland, Oregon. Quarterly data were provided so that the timber harvest could be aggregated on a calendar year basis. Therefore, National Forest harvest for 2001 is for January 1 through December 31, 2001.

<u>Other Federal</u> — These are various other federal agencies (including the military) which sold timber for industrial use. Questionnaires were mailed to the various agencies requesting the calendar year timber harvests.

### **COUNTIES**

There are 39 counties in Washington State. Timber harvests were reported in all 19 western Washington counties and 16 of the 20 eastern Washington counties. No timber harvests were reported for Adams, Benton, Franklin and Grant counties which are located in the Columbia River Basin of eastern Washington. See Figure 1 on page 11 for county locations.

### **VOLUME**

Timber volume data are in thousand board feet (MBF), Scribner rule. Some volume may be based on cruised volume rather than scale of volume removed. Tonnage (a weight-based measure) is included as a portion of the harvest from the Forest Industry and both Private Large and Private Small lands, but is converted to Scribner thousand board feet (MBF) using conversion factors as follows:

Chipwood...

9 tons being equivalent to one MBF, and for

Small logs (Eastside)...

6.5 tons being equivalent to one MBF.

The conversion factors are for green timber and are the ones provided by the Department of Revenue. The tons harvested in 2001, when converted, totaled 307,908 MBF. A total of 11 percent of the statewide 2001 private timber harvest from Forest Industry, Private Large, and Private Small timberlands (in terms of the Scribner scale used in this report) was comprised of the converted tonnage provided by the Department of Revenue<sup>2</sup>. Native American harvests are not included in the DoR data.

Those owners classified as Private Small may use the Department of Revenue short report form. Under the short form of reporting, all volumes are reported as "Conifer" and/or "Hardwoods." Therefore, the short form Private Small harvest volumes reported by specific species may be lower than the actual harvest by specific species, but the total harvest will be correct. On the individual county and Eastside and Westside summary tables an asterisk (\*) identifies where this distribution of the Private Small harvests impacted the reported volumes.

### SPECIES<sup>3</sup>

Eastern Washington softwood species reported: <u>Douglas-fir, true firs</u> (grand, noble, Pacific silver, and subalpine), <u>larch</u> (subalpine and western), <u>ponderosa pine</u>, <u>other pines</u> (lodgepole, western white, and whitebark), and <u>other conifers</u> (Alaska-cedar, Engelmann spruce, mountain hemlock, western hemlock and western redcedar).

Eastern Washington hardwoods are labeled as "other hardwoods" (bigleaf maple, black cottonwood, quaking aspen, red alder, western paper birch, white alder and willow).

Western Washington softwood species reported: <u>Douglas-fir</u>, <u>western hemlock</u> (including mountain hemlock), <u>cedars</u> (Alaska-cedar and Western redcedar), <u>true firs</u> (grand, noble, Pacific silver, and subalpine), and <u>other conifers</u> (Engelmann spruce, lodgepole pine, Pacific yew, ponderosa pine, Sitka spruce, western juniper, western larch, western white pine, and whitebark pine).

Hardwood species reported for western Washington include <u>red alder</u> and <u>other hardwoods</u> (bigleaf maple, bitter cherry, black cottonwood, Pacific madrone, Oregon ash, Oregon white oak, Pacific dogwood, quaking aspen, western paper birch and willow).

Listed on the following page are common and scientific names of most forest tree species growing in Washington.

### **Data Adjustments**

Private timber harvesters recorded on their Forest Excise Tax returns the timberland owner classes (Forest Industry, Private Large, or Private Small) for 1,931,309 MBF of the 2,791,230 MBF of timber harvested from these private lands. For 2001, 859,921 MBF of private timber harvest was harvested on unknown private ownerships. The allocation of this 859,921 MBF to the three private owner classes is described below. Efforts were made to make this allocation an objective process by consulting past timber harvest reports and using timberland ownership information.

In eastern Washington 441,138 MBF of private timber harvest was recorded on Forest Excise Tax returns. Of this volume, 104,525 MBF (23.7 percent) was not reported by owner class and was in aggregate distributed approximately 31 percent to Forest Industry, 1 percent to Private Large and 68 percent to Private Small.

No adjustments were made in the following eastern Washington timber harvesting counties: Asotin, Chelan, Columbia, Douglas, Lincoln and Whitman. In Ferry, Okanogan, Pend Oreille and Walla Walla counties all of the unknown owner volume was placed in the Forest Industry category. In Stevens County all of the unknown owner volume was placed in the Private Small Category.

In western Washington there were 2,350,092 MBF of private timber harvest reported on Forest Excise Tax returns. Of this volume, 755,396 MBF (32 percent) was not reported by owner class and was in aggregate distributed 62.7 percent to Forest Industry, 10.1 percent to Private Large and 27.2 percent to Private Small.

There were some allocations which did not approximate the generalized allocation mentioned above, and these differences are noted as follows. For Island County all harvest volume was reported as Private Small so no unknown volume needed to be allocated. For Clark, Cowlitz and San Juan counties all unknown volume was assigned to Private Small. For Clark, Cowlitz, Island, Jefferson, Pacific, Pierce, San Juan, Skamania, Snohomish and Wahkiakum counties no unknown volume was assigned to Private Large. For Clallam, Island, Jefferson and Wahkiakum counties no unknown volume was allocated to Private Small. For Jefferson and Wahkiakum counties all volume was assigned to Forest Industry. However, the harvest distributions by species were used as reported to the Department of Revenue.

Because the Department of Natural Resources (the state owner class) now sells primarily lump-sum timber sales, DNR timber harvests by species are estimates based on DNR timber sales summary information. Estimates of harvest activities by species were made by consulting the DNR's "Timber Sales Statewide Summary Report," "Western Washington Board Sales" and "Eastern Washington Board Sales" reports listing aggregate annual sales volumes by species.

Figure 1. Western and Eastern Washington Showing County Boundaries




Figure 2. Statewide and Region Harvests by Decade 1870-1999




Figure 3. Statewide and Region Harvests






Figure 4. Statewide Harvests Private, National Forest and Other Public 1950 - 2000







Statewide Washington Timber Harvests by Species 1985 - 2001






