Within Units #1-#5, Purchaser shall cut all hardwood stems 6 feet tall or greater, leaving a stump no more than 12 inches in height.

No operations are permitted within the Operation Exclusion Area as indicated by red flagging right side of B-0400.2 Road from station 3+10 to station 4+10. The Operation Exclusion Area is identified on the Timber Sale, Logging Plan, and Road Plan maps.

A minimum of 5-business days notification is required prior to beginning any logging operations within Units #1 and #5, and operations on the B-0400.2 Road.

Trees marked with a double band of blue paint are non-tradeable and shall not be cut.

Cedar bark stripping/pulling has and will occur within the sale area prior to harvest operations. Unless designated as a leave tree, all freshly stripped cedar is considered sale volume and shall be felled and removed during harvest operations.

Tailhold locations are restricted due to protection of potentially unstable slopes. Trees shall not be used as tailholds within non-tradeable leave tree clumps within the sale area, or locations identified as Slope Stability Mitigation Zones on the Timber Sale and Logging Plan Maps.

Per H-040, Purchaser is required to prepare a harvest plan to include tailhold, skid trail and cable corridor locations, safety in high-use areas, and other items.

If the Purchaser elects to hang cables across the B-Line, they shall give five (5) business days' notice, and provide traffic control during yarding operations. Caution signs and a flag person(s) shall be positioned to provide safe passage of traffic both directions.

Crossings of Type 5 streams may be allowed at locations approved in writing by the Contract Administrator. Purchaser shall place a culvert or log puncheon at crossing locations (when water is present) to protect the stream bank and prevent sedimentation. All materials placed in and/or over the stream at these crossings shall be removed immediately upon completion of yarding on that skid trail.

Rubber tired skidders are allowed only on the skid trail locations pre-approved by the Contract Administrator in Unit #4. The skid trails in Unit #4 will be closed after use per H-140.

The Purchaser is required to provide a minimum of five (5) days' notice before closing trails, or moving into Unit #2. Prior to close-out, Purchaser is responsible for repairing trails to preoperation condition, in accordance with Schedule A.


