# About Gothic Basin



Gothic Basin is in the Morning Star Natural Resources Conservation Area (NRCA). This 37,842-acre mountainous conservation area protects outstanding examples of native plant communities and other ecological features, such

as subalpine meadows, wetlands, and lakes.



### THE ISSUE

- Gothic Basin is a high-use, unmanaged destination in the Morning Star NRCA
- Trails are user built, absent consideration of sensitive plants or other features the NRCA was created to protect
- No signage to educate users or direct use
- Indiscriminate camping, in some cases in sensitive locations next to lakes or in seasonally ponded areas
- Hazardous trail conditions in places, including snow bridges prone to collapse

#### WHAT DNR IS DOING THIS SUMMER/ EARLY FALL 2018

- Conducting trails planning process to prioritize work in the larger Morning Star NRCA for next 10 years
- Incorporating Gothic Basin into the suite of managed sites in the NRCA
- Conducting biological/physical site assessment work to inform site planning and development to follow as funding is obtained; installing one toilet at Gothic Basin
- This work is planned during the weeks of September 10, October 8 or October 23, and will include drone and helicopter flights in/ around Gothic Basin; dates are subject to change related to helicopter availability and wildfires

#### WHAT YOU (THE PUBLIC) CAN DO TO HELP

Consider limiting visitation to Gothic Basin to day use only until camp sites can be designated in locations to protect sensitive features

If you camp, avoid locations that are adjacent to streams & lakes, or in seasonally ponded areas
