





Description: Navy has applied for easement for purposes of buffering existing, adjacent military operation areas and ranges from incompatible land uses. The proposed easement would preclude DNR from authorizing new near-shore commercial or industrial construction within the easement area, with the exception of aquaculture and shellfish harvest. The easement would not convey the Navy any rights to place or construct any buildings, structures, or other improvements of any kind on the property, or to occupy the property for any specific use. The easement would not affect existing leases, easements, or licenses on DNR-managed lands, which would be allowed to continue and may be-reauthorized so long as otherwise consistent with other state laws and rules.

The easement is proposed for certain bedlands of Hood Canal fronting Kitsap County, beginning immediately south of the Hood Canal Bridge and extending to the south Kitsap County line, lying between a line 200 feet waterward of extreme low tide or the -18 foot mean low low water (MLLW) contour, whichever is closest to shore, and the -70 foot MLLW contour.

Submerged bedlands may contain eelgrass and macroalgae, though generally the areas are deeper than most eelgrass communities. Habitat for a wide range of benthic communities and fish.

State managed aquatic lands. May be used for geoduck harvests based on availability and management information. Bedlands proposed for protection under restrictive easement are currently undeveloped and not subject to existing lease agreements.

Waterward, the Hood Canal is used for Navigation including transit of Navy vessels and Coast Guard Transit Protection forces.

Adjacent tidelands are a mix of privately owned and state owned tidelands. Tidelands may be used for aquaculture and may also include residential docks or floats.

The submerged lands can be accessed via tidelands or from the water by boat. In most tidal conditions, the bedlands are not accessible from land. The proposed area of protection would begin immediately South of the Hood Canal Bridge and extend along the east Kitsap County shoreline 200 feet waterward from the extreme low tide line to a depth of -70 Mean Low Low Water (MLLW) South to Section 35, T24N, R3W. W.M.

The Navy is proposing to execute a Real Estate transaction through our encroachment partnering multi-year agreement to place a restrictive easement on bedlands in Kitsap County on the east side of Hood Canal. This transaction will continue the protection proposed under the restrictive easement for bedlands requested on the west side of Hood Canal in Jefferson and Mason counties. The restrictive easement will limit uses that are incompatible with military operating areas and Navy mission in Hood Canal. The Restrictive Easement will prohibit the construction of wharves, piers, docks, floating structures and other construction. The restrictive easement will not limit aquaculture or geoduck harvest. The easement would restrict development on Bedlands beginning at 3 fathoms to a depth of -70 MLLW.

The easement area would begin just south of the Hood Canal bridge at Section 12, T27N, R1E, W.M. and extend along the east shoreline (Kitsap County) south to Section 35, T24N, R3W, W.M.

The Navy has military operating areas and operations and missions in Hood Canal that can be impaired or disrupted by incompatible land uses or marine activities. To prevent encroachment on the military operating areas and ensure long term compatibility in Hood Canal, the Navy is proposing to execute an agreement for Restrictive Easements on State owned aquatic Bedlands in Hood Canal (See attached maps).

As part of the larger Compatibility and Readiness Sustainment Program and a multi-year Encroachment Partnering agreement the Navy is working with partners to execute Real Estate agreements on uplands, tidelands and bedlands to ensure compatible uses are maintained in Hood Canal. This JARPA focuses on the bedlands restrictive easement transaction along the east (Kitsap County) side of Hood Canal. This transaction is a follow-on action to the west (Jefferson County) easement previously requested by the Navy and currently in progress with DNR.




