If DNR finds my statement in the Affidavit of Insufficient Resources to be false, I agree to reimburse DNR for all reasonable and auditable costs incurred for the removal and disposal of my vessel. These costs include, but are not limited to, costs incurred in storing, stripping, using, auctioning, selling, salvaging, scrapping, or disposing of the vessel, removal and disposal costs, all administrative costs incurred by DNR associated with the vessel, and costs associated with environmental damages directly or indirectly caused by the vessel. I understand that DNR may also pursue any additional remedies allowed by law.
