35	Tour Stop #1 – Stillman Creek, Weyerhaeuser Property
36	Bob Bilby, Weyerhaeuser Company, explained the dynamics and impacts of landslides in
37	forested environments of southwestern Washington.

39	Jim Ward, Weyerhaeuser Company, described the field analysis that was performed and the
40	process followed by Weyerhaeuser for the forest practices applications in the Stillman Creek
41	basin.

43	Jack Shambo and Gary Graves, DNR, explained the process DNR followed for the review and
44	approval of the Stillman Creek forest practices application.

46	David Montgomery, University of Washington, made a presentation explaining the dynamics
47	of landslides and the relationship of landslide identification and the forest practices review
48	process in southwestern Washington.

1 2 **Tour Stop #2 – Falkner Fish Passage Barrier Replacement** 3 Mary McDonald, DNR, explained the importance of replacing fish passage barriers on small 4 forest landowner streams and presented an overview of the Family Forest Fish Passage 5 Program (FFFPP). 6 7 Bob Falkner, small forest landowner, emphasized the positive financial impact of FFFPP for 8 his family and other small forest landowners. He asked the Board to consider simplifying the 9 rules to make it easier for small forest landowners to follow the rules and properly manage 10 their lands. 11 Tour Stop #3 – Small Forest Landowner Blow-down Harvest 12 13 Rex Hapala, DNR, explained how Pacific Cascade Region is expediting forest practices 14 applications for blow-down harvests on small forest landowner properties. 15 **Tour Stop #4 – Rue Creek Blow-down Alternate Plan** 16 17 Chuck Turley and Gary Graves, DNR, Stephen Bernath, Department of Ecology, and David Whipple, Department of Fish and Wildlife outlined the procedures for review and approval by 18 19 state agencies of blow-down alternate plans for timber harvest within riparian areas. 20 21 Tour Stop #5 – Woody Debris Removal from Agriculture Site 22 Eric Schroff and Gary Graves, DNR described how DNR has contracted the removal of large 23 woody debris from the December 2007 storm event from agricultural lands in the Chehalis 24 basin.
