Call to Order

• Chair Gary Letzring called the meeting to order shortly after 8:00 a.m.

- The Board members introduced themselves.
- Guests were asked to self-introduce.

Brief Items and Reports

- Approval of July 27, 2023, meeting minutes. The minutes were approved as published.
- Monument Removal/Destruction Permits and Records update:

Dennis Studeman reported that since the July 27 meeting:

- Received **66** LCRs (57 in previous period)
- Processed 121 Permits to Remove or Destroy a Monument (302 in previous period)
- Processed 125 Completion Reports (99 in previous period)
- 5,300 total indexes added to WebXtender
- **PDH Program** Dennis Studeman reported no changes at this time.
- Report from Auditor's Recording Liaison from Washington State Association of County Auditor's (WSACA) to SAB:

Casey Kaul reported:

- Dennis Studeman of the PLSO made a presentation at the County Auditor's Association conference in September. Kris Horton of BRPELS also attended.
- An additional \$100 will be added to survey recordings on January 1, 2024.
- Vicky Dalton, WSACA Chairperson, is seeing many out of state surveyors not meeting recording standards. She requested help from BRPELS to remind surveyors of these standards.

• SAB Liaison to WSACA:

Gary Letzring reported:

- Casey is looking for a speaker to talk on Boundary Line Adjustments and Boundary Line Agreements at an Auditors' meeting in 2024.
- Vicky Dalton, WSACA Chairperson, is seeing many out of state surveyors not meeting recording standards. She requested help from BRPELS to remind

surveyors of these standards.

• Report from Land Surveyors' Association of Washington (LSAW) Liaison:

Tom Barger reported:

- There was much consternation at the North Puget Sound Chapter meeting and the Board of Directors meeting concerning the proposed amendments to WAC 332-120 and WAC 332-130.
- Tom is working with Ken Swindaman to create a pamphlet on monument preservation to disseminate to contractors through the "one call" utility locates system.

• Report from Washington Council of County Surveyors (WCCS) Liaison:

Pat Beehler reported:

- There is \$30,000+/- in the bank, but the group seems dormant at this time.
- The Council would need to vote to change the by-laws to become the Washington Council of Government Surveyors.
- Update of GPS Guidebook 2004:

Bob Morse reported:

- Work on the guidebook is in progress.
- A draft version may be available soon for a select audience.

• 02A Account

Pat Beehler reported:

- PLSO current balance is \$368,406, but administrative charges are taken from the account at a variable rate each month.
- We have seen a bump in income in September due to the survey recording fee

increase, although, recording levels are down statewide.

• WAC 332-120 proposed amendments

- Pat stated that the intent of the new proposed amendment is to eliminate engineers from being able to stamp/sign Monument Removal or Destruction Permits; only Professional Land Surveyors should stamp/sign Monument Removal or Destruction Permits, and set monuments.
- Discussion took place regarding the roles of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors.
 - Paul Galli suggested that we should attempt to obtain an official opinion from the DNR Assistant Attorney General (AAG) and the BRPELS AAG.

• WAC 332-130 proposed amendments

• Pat stated that the proposal introduced recently was a hot issue within the profession. The proposal was tabled for now.
