Rock for this proposal may be obtained from the State owned North Rim Quarry, as well as from the existing stockpile at the North Rim Quarry, at no cost to the Purchaser or any commercial rock source at the Purchaser's expense.

Purchaser is required to provide a stockpile of 3,200 cy of 2 inch minus in the North Rim Quarry per Road Plan 6-65.

All road work activities (except for the AA-0200 Ext. and AA-0200A roads) will not be permitted from November 1 to April 30, nor on weekends or State recognized holidays, unless authority to do so is granted, in writing, by the Contract Administrator. If permission is granted to operate during a seasonal closure period, a maintenance plan is required per Road Plan clause 1-26. Additionally, all road work, including both construction and abandonment, on the AA-0200 Ext. and AA-0200A roads will not be permitted from October 1 to June 14, nor on weekends or State recognized holidays, unless authority is granted, in writing, by the State. The temporary bridge at STA 15+86 will only be allowed to overwinter one season.

The hauling of forest products will not be permitted from November 1 to April 30, nor on weekends or State recognized holidays, from Units \#1, \#3-\#8, unless authorized in writing by the Contract Administrator. If permission is granted to haul from Units \#1, and \#3-\#8 from November 1 to April 30, preventative measures may be required to protect water, soil, roads and other forest assets. The hauling of forest products will not be permitted from November 1 to April 30, nor on weekends or State recognized holidays, from Unit \#2 (AA-0200 Ext. and AA-0200A roads) unless authorized in writing by the State.

## ACREAGE DETERMINATION

CRUISE METHOD: Acreage was determined by traversing boundaries by GPS in all units, and length times width for existing road in Unit \#8. GPS data files are available at DNR's website for timber sale auction packets. See cruise narrative for cruise method.

FEES: $\quad \$ 151,062.00$ is due on day of sale. $\$ 9.00$ per MBF is due upon removal. These are in addition to the bid price.

SPECIAL REMARKS: See map for gate locations. Gate keys may be obtained by contacting the South Puget Sound Region office at (360) 825-1631 or by contacting the Tumwater work center at (425) 681-0448.

Purchaser shall cut all hardwood stems 2 inches DBH or greater, or 6 feet tall or greater, within Units \#1-\#4, leaving a stump no more than 12 inches in height.

Williams Northwest Pipeline and the contract administrator must be notified a minimum of 7 calendar days in advance of work within two tree lengths of the pipeline in Units \#1 and \#2 and along the AA-Line.

Gas pipeline within Units \#1 and \#2 will require equipment crossing structures to be constructed to cross the pipeline. Williams Northwest Pipeline and the contract administrator must be contacted a minimum of 7 calendar days prior to constructing the crossing structures, and they must be onsite when the equipment crossings are constructed and at the initial equipment crossings of the pipeline.

No timber shall be felled onto, no timber shall be decked on, and no equipment shall park on the gas pipeline right-of-way.

A temporary bridge is to be installed on the AA-0200 Ext. road at STA 15+86. The bridge is provided by DNR and located at Mima Pit. Two equipment crossings with logs and slash placed will be permitted for each entry (two at temporary bridge installation, and another two at the temporary bridge removal). There are down woody debris requirements at the fish stream crossing that are detailed in Road Plan sections 3-6 and 311.

Special road construction requirements on the AA-0200 Ext and AA-0220 roads include down woody debris requirements in WMZs, as indicated in the Road Plan Section 11. Trees identified for down woody debris requirements in Right of Way Units \#5 and \#6 are marked with a double band of red paint.

Purchaser shall provide and install an 18 foot steel gate per Road Plan 7-76.
In Units \#1 and \#2 there are blue painted trees. Blue painted trees are take trees, unless located within tagged leave tree area clumps.

The Cooper Rd NW is temporarily closed. An alternate route via the A-5000 to the KCLine is allowed during this closure.

From McCleary at the Hwy 8 overpass on Mox Chehalis Rd, head south on Mox Chehalis Rd

- After 1.3 miles on Mox Chehalis Rd., turn left (east) on a private driveway and proceed 0.10 miles to the AA-Line gate.
- Continue on the AA-Line for 1.5 miles to Unit 3.
- From Unit 3, continue approximately 0.5 miles to Unit 8 R/W. From Unit 8 R/W, continue on the AA-Line 0.4 miles. Continue straight for access to Unit 1 and Unit $5 R / W$, and turn right (east) onto the AA-0200 for access to Units 2 and 6 R/W.

Heading west on Hwy 8 between mileposts 14 and 13:

- Turn left (south) onto the KC-Line continue for 2 miles.

    From Usk travel southwest on Hwy 20 for 0.4 miles. Take a right onto Hwy 211 S/ WA-211. Continue for 9.8 miles and turn right onto Fertile Valley Rd. Continue for 3.5 miles. Turn right onto Harworth Rd. Continue for 0.55 miles and take a slight left to stay on Harworth Rd. Continue for 1.25 miles. Take a left onto Buck Creek Rd. Continue for about 1.8 miles. Go past the gate. Continue for 0.3 miles past the gate and take a right to onto road E314329E. Drive 1.6 miles. Take a right onto E314334E and travel 0.2 miles to the intersection. To access the upper road on Unit 1: At the intersection, take a right on road E314321F. Continue for 1 mile and take a left on the new E314316G road to reach U1.To access Units 2 \& 3: At the intersection, take a left onto E314321A. Drive about 780 feet and go past the gate.
