## Pick Up Sticks Driving Directions

Turn east onto NE Healy Rd from SR 503 between mile markers 24 and 25 and travel 2.4 miles to USFS 54. Continue on USFS 54 for 2.8 miles, then turn left (north) onto the $\mathrm{S}-1000$ for 0.3 miles.

## Units 1 and 4 (ROW)

Continue right (east) at the fork on the $\mathrm{S}-1000$ for 0.3 miles to Units 1 and 4. From here, the units are accessed by continuing straight on the RS-1000 for 0.3 miles. Unit 1 can also be accessed by turning right (east) on the S-1000 for 0.2 miles.

## Unit 2, 6 (ROW), and 9 (Waste Area)

To Unit 9, from the S-1000/RS-1000 junction turn right (east) on the S-1000 and continue for 0.25 miles. Continue another 0.4 miles for units 2 and 6 .

## Units 3, 7 (ROW), and 8 (ROW)*

To access unit 3, continue on the USFS 54 for another 1.7 miles and turn left (north) onto the 8050 Rd. Continue for 1.2 miles until it becomes the S-1010. Continue 0.6 miles, stay right (north) at the fork, and the road turns into the $\mathrm{S}-1000$ for another 2.5 miles. Turn right (north) onto the $\mathrm{S}-2000$ for 1.7 miles until the S-2400. Turn right (south) on the S-2400 for 1 mile for unit 3 . Or continue straight (east) for 0.8 miles until the $\mathrm{S}-2050$. Turn right (south) for 2 miles to unit 3 . Or continue straight (northeast) 0.6 miles until the $\mathrm{S}-2070$, turn right (south) and continue another 0.6 miles to units 8 and 3 . For unit 7 , stay left (south) at the fork to go on the $\mathrm{S}-2072$ for 0.2 miles. It is 0.4 miles on the $\mathrm{S}-2070$ or 0.2 miles on the S 2072 to unit 3.

## Units 5 (ROW) and 10 (ROW)
